# How to Get to Hansen Woodland Farm

Spokane Airport is given as a reference point for directions because it's just off I-90, which many guests use to get to Hansen Woodland Farm. Guests coming from the north and northwest (e.g., Bellingham, Canada) may need different directions. Backroads directions from various points in the Pacific Northwest are available on request.

**\*BIG HEADS-UP IF YOU ARE USING GPS:** GPS MAY tell you that you've arrived about 3 miles before you actually have. Keep going and look for the intersection of Inchelium Hwy and Lake Ellen Rd. That landmark tells you you are about a half-mile away. Next landmark is a speed-limit sign; you are almost here. Then look for flagpole and signage described above.

ROUTES from SPOKANE AIRPORT: 2 choices

1. I-90 to 395:

From Airport, take I-90 E/US-2 E to Spokane. Take exit for Division St/ US 395.

Follow US-395 N to WA-20 W (about 77 miles)


Once you cross the Columbia River after going through Kettle Falls, you will dead-end at the Colville Fuels/Noisy Waters convenience store/gas station. Turn left here onto Hwy 20 W. You'll go about 5 miles on Hwy 20 and look for a sign to turn off on Inchelium Hwy on the left.

Take that left and go another 5 miles.

Look for intersection with Lake Ellen Rd. That tells you you're about a half-mile away. Address is 520 Inchelium Hwy. It's on the right, with mailbox across from driveway. You will see a flagpole with flag and tree-farm signage at my driveway. Turn right into 700-ft. driveway, and you'll see house at top of hill to the left of driveway. You will notice driveway continues up a second hill; DO NOT go up this hill; you have already

**ROUTES from SPOKANE AIRPORT: 2nd choice**  
Hwy 2 to Rt.231 to US 395: Head south on W Airport Dr  
Turn left onto S Spotted Rd  
Turn left onto US-2 W (signs for Davenport)  
Go 17.2 mi till you hit the town of Reardan (30 mph speed limit)  
Turn right onto WA-231 N.  
Take that all the way till it intersects with 395. You will be just south of Chewelah (note: Gas tends to be cheaper in Chewelah, which is also a speed trap). Then pick up directions on previous page with "Follow US-395 N to WA-20W"



**NOTE:** Above route is more scenic but not recommended at night or in bad weather because it's full of twists and turns.

# Gas and Groceries on the Way

You will probably want to pick up some groceries on your way to Hansen Woodland Farm. The kitchen here is reasonably well-stocked, but the selection is a little random. You can expect basic breakfast items (eggs, bacon, OJ, half-n-half for coffee, coffee, tea, butter, fruit [usually oranges and apples]).\* You'll also find a spice cabinet stocked with most herb and spice needs. And a good collection of random nonperishables. But you'll probably want to pick up meal basics.

If you're coming north on 395, here are some grocery options:

- Deer Park (about 1.5 hours away): Yoke's Fresh Market, 810 S Main St., Deer Park
- Chewelah (about 1 hour away) Safeway, W 10 Colville Ave, Chewelah (on 395)

NOTE: Chewelah is also usually the best place to get the cheapest gas in the area: HICO, south of Chewelah and JMT, north of Chewelah.

- Colville (about 40 mins away) Grocery Outlet, 980 S Main St, Colville (at roundabout at south end of town; somewhat random selection)
- Colville (about 40 mins away) Safeway, 391 N Main St, Colville
- Colville (about 40 mins away) Walmart, 810 N Hwy, Colville
- Kettle Falls (about 15 mins away), Meyers Falls Market, 160E 3rd Ave, Kettle Falls (395) (natural foods)
- Kettle Falls (about 15 mins away), Harvest Foods, 260 W Third, Hwy 395, Kettle Falls (small-but-adequate grocery store; good meats)

# Parking at Hansen Woodland Farm

You will find ample parking at the top of the driveway, in front of the house, extending to the pumphouse/woodshed. You are also welcome to park in the carport, adjacent to the garage.

**Garage parking:** If you would like to park your vehicle in the garage, please request keypad code for garage door. Larger vehicles may not fit in garage.

To close garage door, or open it from the inside, use this lighted green button next to the door between the garage and the house.


## IF GARAGE-DOOR KEYPAD DOES NOT WORK:

If you are inside the house and opener doesn't work, check to see if green light is illuminated on the opener button in the garage. If not, the problem is most likely the below issue with the GFCI outlet (or a power outage has occurred).

Occasionally, the ground-fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) outlet into which the garage-door opener is plugged needs to be re-set, especially in cases of heavy rain or snow. This outlet is in the "kids room" on the same wall as the sink, behind the little armchairs. Simply press the re-set button, and the opener should work again. Contact host if it doesn't.

## Echo Show (Alexa)

To take advantage of it in advance, you first need the Google Assistant app on your phone. (To use the device while on-site at Hansen Woodland Farm, you do not need Google Assistant or any other app).

On eligible Android phones, the Google Assistant app is built in. On iPhone, you can add it; here is a link to the app:

# Safety Features

## Fire Extinguishers:

- Under downstairs bathroom sink
- In cabinet above kitchen refrigerator

## Fire Escape Ladder:

To left of washer/dryer, upstairs laundry room

**Radon detector:** In kids' room

**Carbon-monoxide detector:** In upstairs hall on top of teapot collection.

**Smoke detectors:** Downstairs hall, upstairs hall, master bedroom

**Motion detector lights on outside buildings** (these sometimes work and sometimes don't). Small motion-detector lights also surround the small front "yard."

**First-Aid kits:** In laundry room and in downstairs bathroom



**Weather-emergency radio:** In utility room.

**Flashlights:** In mudroom, utility room, and chest of drawers in front hall. Emergency flashlights are plugged into several outlets (pictured). Host attempts to leave at least 1 small flashlight in each room at all times, but they often migrate.

Please note: Guests often move items around, and these items don't always find their way back to the places described in this manual. If you can't find something, don't hesitate to ask host via the Airbnb or VRBO platform, by text/phone to 386-871-9490, or by email [DD\\_kathy@tmd9.club](mailto:DD_kathy@tmd9.club).

# Extra information for larger groups and groups with children

I childproof on request for groups with children 4 and under. Please let me know you are bringing a child of that age and/or if you require child-proofing no matter what. PLEASE call to my attention anything significant I may have missed in the childproofing.

If you have more than 4 people in your group, you will likely find that my dining table is too small; however, in the garage, you will find a 6-foot folding table that you can take upstairs. Several extra chairs are available in the laundry room. If you need even more chairs, you may find 2 folding chairs in the utility closet (or ask host). Using those chairs and the dining chairs upstairs, you will probably have enough seating.

There's also a highchair in the utility room. (There's at least 1 Pack 'n Play in the utility room). Additional Pack 'n Play available on request. NOTE: If you use Pack 'n Plays and fold them up when you leave, I will refund \$10 per Pack 'n Play from your rental fee (because I am not capable of folding them).

**Firepit:** Please see the “firepit fun kit” in the mudroom, along with the safety guidelines.

**Toxic Substances:** I try to put toxic substances, such as cleaning products, out of reach when families with young children are here. As of Oct. 1, 2019, most toxic cleaning substances have been replaced with non-toxic, eco-friendly products. You should have minimal worries about chemicals under the sinks.

Many open outlets are covered with outlet covers and more covers are available.

The garage also contains a baby gate (in original shipping box, near furnace) you can use for either kids or dog regarding the stairs.

# House Rules

**No smoking** or vaping of any substance whatsoever. Smoking is too much of a fire hazard on this forested property.

**No hunting on the property:** I know my deer on the property, feed them apples, and consider them friends. Please don't hunt on the property (ask me about the boundaries). Since deer have a habitat radius of about 2 miles, I'd prefer you not hunt within 2 miles of the property.

**No unregistered guests.** The names of ALL people staying in the house must be included in your booking or given to host before check-in.

**Check-in/Check-out:** Please respect check-in (3 pm or later) and checkout (11 a.m. or earlier) times. If cleaning is finished before 3 pm on check-in day, I will let you know. Requests for early check-in or late checkout may be subject to additional fees.

**Pets:** Please let host know if you will be bringing a pet.

**Garage Door:** Please open garage door on only an as-needed basis. For security, pest-control, and climate-control reasons, please do not leave garage door open for prolonged periods, especially when no one is in the house.

**Inoperative security camera:** When you book, you acknowledge the existence of an inoperative security camera in the stairwell of the house. It has never been used and is not connected. A few guests have expressed concerns about it, but I assure you it is not used and doesn't work.

See also **Amenity Limitations**, pages 18 and 19; you must agree to these upon booking.

# House Guidelines

**Garbage/composting:** You are welcome to place any trash or garbage in the kitchen trash can. If it gets full and/or starts to smell, you can close it up and place it in the garage (spring and summer, so it doesn't attract bears) or outside (fall and winter). Feel free to notify me you have trash/garbage to pick up.

I also encourage you to compost organic garbage (in the metal pail on the deck). Please do not place meat, fat, or bones in compost. If pail becomes full, alert me, or empty it in large, black compost bin near garden.

**Combustible Trash:** Especially during the winter, you may want to set aside any trash that can be burned to use as kindling for the woodstove. You will find a supply of combustible trash in the garage and are welcome to add to it.



# House Guidelines



**Heat in the colder months.** You'll find a thermostat in both the upstairs and downstairs halls and can set them as you please (I keep them set at 60 as a baseline). However, I like to save money by heating with the woodstove as much as possible and encourage you to do the same. **PLEASE DO NOT TOUCH ANY CONTROLS ON THE THERMOSTAT OTHER THAN TO MOVE TEMPERATURE UP OR DOWN.**

I will be happy to show you how to start and maintain fires in the woodstove. If you plan to be gone during the daytime, I can build a fire to greet you when you return. Several rooms also have space heaters available. Master bedroom has heated mattress pad, and one is also available for downstairs queen bed.

If you turn up the thermostat ....

...Please turn it back to 60 when you leave.

...Please do not ALSO open windows.

# House Guidelines



**Fire-Starting Tip:** Above is a favorite product for starting fires. The starters are like giant matches. This or another starter product may be available during your visit

**Kindling:** I try to keep a supply of kindling on hand, but between woodstoves in this house and my own house, I sometimes run out. If you don't find any in the house, try some pinecones. Consider setting aside burnable trash as kindling or using burnable trash already in garage.

**Firewood:** Firewood is supplied from about Oct. 15 to April 1. If you would like woodstove fires outside those times, please bring your own firewood.

**NOTE AMENITY LIMITATION; YOU MUST AGREE TO THIS LIMITATION WHEN YOU BOOK:**

**Coolness in the warmer months:** Sorry; the place has **no air conditioning**. Normally, only a handful of days are uncomfortable without AC here. Hansen Woodland Farm benefits from cool breezes that blow off the Columbia River, a mile away. In addition, even on the hottest days, nights are much cooler – in the 50s-70s.

**Fans**

Hansen Woodland Farm has 4 box fans, two table fans, 1 standing fan, and 2 ceiling fans. The portable fans are stored in the utility room downstairs, but during the summer may be dispersed throughout the house.

**Workarounds**

- The hot water heater in the utility rooms vents cold air. So, if you place a fan in front of its open door, you can get the house fairly cool, especially the downstairs, which is significantly cooler than upstairs (the most heat-sensitive members of your group may want to sleep downstairs). I will leave this setup in place when I clean tomorrow.
- A trick I learned from my ex: Leave windows open at night when it's cool and then shut them around 9 a.m. to trap cool air. The house's excellent insulation makes this approach pretty effective.

**To cool off in the water/Swimming/Wading:**

--Haag Cove, 4 miles away, has a swimming beach. Turn left at end of driveway and watch for signs.

--Lake Ellen, 4.5 miles way, has a swimming dock. Take the continuation of the driveway past my house and turn left. Watch for signs.

French Rock: Really more of a wading situation, but still good for cooling off. 3 miles away. Turn right at end of driveway and watch for signs.

–Floating the Kettle River: Ask hosts for details.

Speaking of the water heater: It needs to be vented at all times, so **DO NOT CLOSE** small window in the utility room. **LEAVE IT OPEN** (OK if it's just a crack) and leave the door to the room slightly ajar. If it's too chilly under these conditions, contact host.



**NOTE AMENITY LIMITATION;** YOU MUST AGREE TO THIS LIMITATION WHEN YOU BOOK: Another bummer: No dishwasher. Sorry. However, a full gamut of disposables is available in bottom drawer of console/buffet (pictured). You can find even more in cabinet above refrigerator and in the garage:



# Snow

Typically, we get the first significant snow around Nov. 20. Most years since I've been here, I have seen snow on the ground most of the winter, but rarely epic amounts.

I will take care of **snow removal**. If you need to do any removal before I arrive to do it, you'll find a snow shovel by the door from the garage to the house (or elsewhere in the garage/carport area or leaning against the house). If you find that walking areas around the house are slippery, you can use ashes from the wood stove to provide traction. Get them from metal pail on hearth or bag(s)/garbage can by left side of house. A supply of salt is also sometimes available.

4-wheel drive strongly recommended for driveway.

**Snow "noise:"** During the snowy season, you may sometimes hear loud "wumping" noises. This is the sound of large sheets of snow sliding off the roof.

# House Guidelines ~ continued

**Consumables** (food, beverages, over-the-counter meds, household products/cleaners, toiletries): You are welcome to consume anything consumable you find in the house. If you finish something, I'd appreciate if you wrote it down in case I want to replace it, or leave the empty in a conspicuous place.

**Please consider removing shoes in house:** One of my greatest cleaning challenges at Hansen Woodland Farm is the foyer area downstairs. No matter how many welcome mats and area rugs I put down, I seem to get a lot of muddy footprints in the winter and other wet months.

Thus, I do not require, but ask you consider, removing shoes while in the house.

**Lady GaGa Singing "Edge of Glory:"** If you randomly hear Lady GaGa singing "Edge of Glory," please know that it's the doorbell and is probably either host at the door or a delivery person (as I have my packages delivered there).

**Packages:** As mentioned, my packages are delivered to the Hansen Woodland Farm house. I receive notifications of most deliveries and try to pick up packages promptly. No need for you to do anything with packages unless they are in your way. Please **DO NOT take them inside** because then I won't be able to pick them up till you check out.

**Relocating items:** if you move an item, especially furniture, out of its original place, please return it to its place before checkout. This manual can help you determine where things belong.

## **Pests, Insect:**

**Bees, wasps, and especially yellow-jackets:** These can be annoying in the spring and summer (especially Aug. and Sept.) and are often encountered on the deck and around the property. Measures will be in place to prevent yellow-jacket colonies from forming, but they are not foolproof. You'll find flying-insect killer in strategic places in the house. Contact me if any of these pests are an issue.

**Stinkbugs:** Stinkbug season is early fall - Sept. and Oct. Some people are really bothered by them, but they are harmless, except that yes, they do smell. Please alert me if you're upset by them

**Ants:** The house is treated for ants, but occasionally, I have had a low-level ant invasion in the kitchen or bathrooms. Ant traps/gel/spray stored under the kitchen sink and garage should get rid of them quickly.

## **Pests, rodent**

**Mice and chipmunks:** I have never seen these in the house, nor evidence of them, though years ago, saw evidence in the garage (this is a great reason to keep garage door closed). Let me know if you see any evidence of rodents.

## **Pests, larger mammals:**

**Feral cats:** 5 feral cats make their home part-time in my house and might be seen roaming. They are very timid and run away. They are also spayed/neutered and have had rabies shots.

**Bears:** We do get a bear visit or 2 in the spring when the bears wake up and come searching for food. Keep any food items inside and secure at this time. If you see a bear, making your presence known and yelling, "go away, bear," should be enough to send the ursine scampering off.

## **Pests, larger mammals, continued:**

**Moose:** I've seen one on the property and others in the area. They run away at the first sight of humans.

**Deer:** Though some people consider deer pests, I don't, and I have a regular group that comes around for handouts. You may see them close to the house looking for someone to throw them food; feel free to throw apples.

**Other:** If you encounter or wonder about any critters not on this list, please ask.

**Air Fresheners.** I sometimes (though rarely) keep a couple of plug-in air fresheners going. If they annoy you or you don't care for the smells, feel free to unplug them.

**Water.** On very rare occasions, the house has issues with water pressure/supply. Believe it or not, these are usually caused by ants in the pump mechanism. If you experience any decrease in water pressure, let me know so I can nip the issue in the bud.

**Hot Water:** The house is equipped with an oversized 80-gallon water heater, so water should stay hot, even for larger groups. I have noticed, however, that if the hot water hasn't been used in a while (such as between guests), the first bath or shower afterwards may not achieve maximum heat. All should be well after that.

**Smoke alarms:** Please do not disable or remove smoke alarms (sounds like a no-brainer, but guests have done so).

If a smoke alarm goes off because of cooking or woodstove issues, please open some windows and turn on the hood-exhaust fan over the stove until alarm stops. If a smoke alarm starts “chirping,” because its battery is dying, please either let me know, or grab a 9-volt battery from the top drawer of the chest of drawers in the downstairs hall and replace the battery. If you replace battery and chirping continues, take out the battery, hold the “test” button down for 15 seconds, and then re-insert the battery. Chirping should stop.

**Door between garage and foyer:** If you lock it when you go out, you will be locked out. **Please leave this door UNLOCKED when you check out.**

**Bleach:** If you launder any of the house’s colored sheets or towels, please do not use bleach.

**Dining Table:** If the small dining table in the dining area is not big enough for your group, you can bring up the 6-ft table from the garage. Near furnace.

**Baby gate:** In cardboard box near furnace in garage. As of this writing, it has never been used.

**Pet Supplies:** Extra pet supplies can be found on the shelving unit in the mudroom. **Please do not use any kitchenware for pet dishes.**

**Timers:** A few lights in and around the house may be set to come on and turn off in the evening based on timers. If any of these annoy you, let me know.

**Window Coverings:** All bedrooms have window coverings, but they are NOT blackout coverings. Eye masks are supplied for those who don't like light in the morning.

**Hairdryers:** Find at least one in each bathroom:



Downstairs bath



Upstairs bath

## 2<sup>nd</sup>-Floor Deck

The deck is considered “closed” from Thanksgiving to April 1. That does not mean you can't venture onto the deck during that time, but DO NOT retrieve cushions for the outdoor furniture from the garage and use them on the deck; these cushions are not made for harsh winter weather. I also do not supply charcoal for the grills or clean the grills during this period or shovel snow on the deck.

- **Charcoal:** The deck contains a plastic bin for charcoal briquets; please keep lid tightly on this bin to keep it from

getting wet inside and keep bag of briquets in the supplied plastic bag. Please let host know if you use the last of the charcoal.

- **Can/Glass recycling:** The deck also contains a plastic bin for recycling (primarily cans and glass); please use it rather than any of the trash cans for recyclable materials.
- **Deck door:** I recommend you keep it locked, especially when not in the house.

# Checkout Procedures:

I do not need to be present when you check out (and am not coming into physical contact with guests during the pandemic).

Please leave beds unmade so I know which ones were slept in. Three of the beds at Hansen Woodland Farm (both bunk beds and the day bed in the “orange room”) use a new type of zippered bedding called “Beddy’s,” which is a cross between a sleeping bag and regular sheets + comforter. If you sleep inside the Beddy (as opposed to on top), PLEASE unzip the outside corner and fold back the top comforter when you check out so I know to launder the entire Beddy, not just the top piece.

Please make sure button locks on glass doors to deck (locks in vertical position) and from mudroom to outside are locked. To close/lock mudroom door from the outside when checking out, enter 92715 followed by the # symbol while the door is ajar. Turn the knob to the LEFT as you close the door. No need to lock deadbolt on mudroom door. Please leave door between foyer and garage UNLOCKED when you check out.

~~Please leave garage door opener where you found it.~~ (extra opener is currently MIA).

If you changed the thermostat during your stay, please turn it back to 60.

Summer: Please leave windows open.

Winter: Please make sure windows are closed.

Not required but appreciated: Washing your dishes and cleaning grill(s) before you leave.

# Garage



Combustible trash for fire starting. Starting in mid-October, you will find firewood adjacent to this area in garage.

- Garage also contains backup cleaning supplies and paper products.
- A backup generator can be found in garage; however, it has not been used in several years and host does not know how to use it. In the event of a power outage, you are welcome to try it if you feel you have the expertise. Gas available if needed.

# Outside: Firepit

Fire pit is to the right of house as you are facing front of house. Find Firepit Fun Kit in mudroom, containing marshmallows, choco bars, graham crackers, roasting forks, powder that turns the fire colors, a fire-emergency blanket, and more. A tray is available to transport s'mores supplies to fire pit. String lights overhead add a festive touch. Please adhere to safety guidelines that follow (also on top of Firepit Fun Kit box).



In the warm-weather months, just beyond the firepit, you will find a net for badminton or volleyball and a cornhole set, with supplies for those games in the corner of the garden, closest to the net.

# Firepit Safety Guidelines

Fire pit is to the right of house as you are facing front of house. Find Firepit Fun Kit in mudroom, containing marshmallows, choco bars, graham crackers, roasting forks, powder that turns the fire colors, a fire-emergency blanket and more.

- Please read these guidelines before using firepit!
- Please do not use fire pit in extremely windy conditions.
- Please burn only firewood from inside house (garage), along with natural kindling, such as pinecones.
- Please don't use any kind of accelerant to start the fire. You may use commercial firestarters from inside the house.
- It's a good idea to rake flammable debris such as pinecones and pine needles out of the circle surrounding the firepit before starting fire (or toss them in cauldron as kindling).
- Observe carefully any sparks that fly up to trees or other flammable objects.
- Please watch children carefully and do not allow them to get too close to the fire.
- A bucket for water, bucket of sand (sometimes absent), hose, and fire blanket are available if fire gets out of hand.
- Please extinguish fires completely, preferably using the sand in bucket.
